<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Egypt is situated in the northeast corner of the Africa – what it is like today. Understanding chronology - when was the Ancient Egyptian civilisation? The story of ancient Egypt as one of the greatest civilizations of the past. Monuments and tombs of their Pharaohs continue to stand intact today, some 4,000 years later! To understand how the monuments and artefacts the Ancient Egyptians left behind tell us about their lives, leaders and beliefs. To find out about Ancient Egypt and why it still grips our imagination today – the country, the people, their way of life The history of the lands is usually broken into three kingdoms: Old, Middle and New. During these three kingdoms, the lands were ruled by a sequence of pharaohs. To learn about the great Pharaohs and leaders of Ancient Egypt ~ Queen Nefertiti, Hatshepsut; Tutankhamun To learn about Egyptian tombs, pyramids and burial sites – Valley of the Kings, mummification, the weighing of the heart ceremony and the journey to the afterlife. To find out about Tutankhamun, the discovery of his tomb and how artefacts can teach us about the past Ancient Egypt and the Old testament Bible -takes place in or around Egypt. Egypt also plays a major role in the life of many Bible people from Moses and Joseph to Jesus. The River Nile - to learn about the Egyptian landscape and find out how it impacted on people's lives in Ancient Egypt - Ancient Egyptians lived along the banks of the river Nile in Egypt as it provided, water, food. transportation & excellent soil for growing food The Ancient Egyptians helped us learn a lot about maths, medicine and farming. They also made their own paper out of reeds, (papyrus), and wrote using pictures called hieroglyphics.
