Henry VIII wives The changing religions during the Tudor time period Other Tudor Monarchs - Edward VI, Lady Jane Grey (Queen for 9 days but never crowned) and Elizabeth I were brought up as Protestant. Mary I was brought up as committed Catholic, Life in Tudor England <p>Stuarts</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Reign of James I The Puritans gained power in Parliament What life was like under the Puritans. Charles I How Charles I actions upset people Why there was a civil war Charles I's reign they had gained enough support in Parliament to pass laws imposing their views about living on all English people Why Charles I was executed Parliamentarians and the Royalists often called Roundheads and Cavaliers. Head of the Parliamentarians – Oliver Cromwell Charles II was restored to the throne in 1660. He liked entertainment and reopened the theatres, Inns and allowed much more freedom.
