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Vision & Values





Reading Hut which contains a broad range of fiction and non-fiction texts and a chill out zone for children to relax and enjoy the books they have chosen.


There are a number of other outdoor learning areas that children can use during lesson time and play time.

We carefully monitor the children with special educational needs and provide additional support when necessary. This could be both in class support or small group support. We work closely with our families to meet all the children's needs.




Our Community




