2		Who was the 'lady with lamp'?	What do nurses do?	Florence Nightingale was a nurse. Born in 1820 (around 200 years ago). She became a nurse against parents' wishes ~ role/expectations of women. She treated soldiers during the Crimean War in Scutari. Why she was called the lady with the lamp.
3		Why was Florence Nightingale a superhero?	Florence Nightingale was a nurse. Why she was known as the lady with the lamp. She lived at a time when women worked in the home rather than having a job.	Nurses had no training until FN set up nursing schools. What hospitals were like before/after her input: improved hygiene, working conditions, patient care and training ~ in Scutari and then in UK. Made nursing a respectable career for women.
4		Do we all get treated the same? (Mary Seacole)	Florence Nightingale treated soldiers in the Crimean War. Hospitals were not hygienic when Florence Nightingale arrived in Scutari.	Mary Seacole was a nurse ~ used herbal remedies. Born in 1805 ~ similar time to FN. British Government refused to let her join FN's team of nurses, so she travelled there herself. Some say she was refused due to the colour of her skin.
5		Why was Mary Seacole a superhero?	Mary Seacole went to the Crimean War even though the British Government said she couldn't go. She used herbal remedies.	Became known as 'Mother Seacole'. Set up a 'British Hotel' hospital for soldiers to receive food, drink and treatment. Treated soldiers from both sides of the war ~ even going onto the battlefield to give treatment.

6		Do superheroes still live amongst us?	Why Florence Nightingale and Mary Seacole can be considered superheroes.	Covid is a new illness that has made lots of people poorly since 2020. Professor Sarah Gilbert ~ developed one Covid 19 vaccine (Oxford-Astrazeneca). How doctors and nurses have helped people during Covid.
