Events of the Wright brothers' lives that led to 1 st aeroplane flight. 1st aeroplane flight was in 1903 (17 th December). The Wright Flyer flew 120 feet in 12 seconds. Their aeroplane was called the Wright Flyer. |
| 3 | | How have aeroplanes changed since 1903? | What the Wright brothers' aeroplane looked like. | How the appearance of planes has changed since 1903 (materials, structure, size, speed). |
| 4 | | How far can you fly? | The first flight was in 1903. The Wright Flyer flew 120 feet in 12 seconds. | Timeline of the history of flight ~ aeroplanes progressed from flying short distances to flying across oceans then flying around the world. Key events to include (children not expected to remember the dates): 1903 ~ the Wright flyer flew 120 feet in 12 seconds. 1919 ~ first non-stop trans-Atlantic flight. 1919 ~ first international passenger flights. 1986 ~ first non-stop flight around the world. 2016 ~ first non-stop flight around the world in a solar-powered plane. Present day ~ aeroplanes can fly up to 10,000 miles on a tank of fuel. Achievements of Concorde: 1973 – 2003. |
