1	Events beyond living memory that are significant nationally or globally.	What do I live in?	Human features of Stockingford.	Different types of home ~ detached, semi-detached, terraced, bungalow, flat/apartment.
2		Have houses always been made out of brick? (present day, Celtic, Tudor)	Henry VII was the first Tudor monarch in 1485.	Celtic period ~ before Christ's birth. Present day houses ~ brick, tile, glass. Tudor houses ~ wattle and daub, thatched roof, some glass. Celtic houses ~ wattle and daub, thatched roof, no windows. They were called roundhouses. Tudor and Celtic houses were very different even though they were made of the same materials.
3		How would you cook your dinner? (present day, Celtic, Tudor)	What present day, Tudor and Celtic houses were made from. Tudor period started in 1485. Celtic period was before Christ's birth.	Present day ~ gas / electric ovens, microwaves, fridges/freezers for storing food. Tudor ~ ate a lot of fresh food which was stored in a larder, food cooked on a fire, bread was baked in a large stone oven. Celtic ~ cooked on a fire in the middle of the house, used a cauldron or a spit for meat.
4		Where is your toilet? (present day, Celtic, Tudor)	Tudor period started in 1485. Celtic period was before Christ's birth. Facts about present day, Tudor and Celtic houses.	Present day ~ houses have at least one toilet inside. Tudor ~ toilet was called a privy ~ piece of wood over a bowl or a hole in the ground and did not flush. Wiped bottoms with leaves or moss, although richer people used lamb's wool. Celtic ~ a hole in the ground with a wattle and daub structure surrounding it for privacy.
5		Did everybody live the same way?	Aspects of life in Tudor and Celtic times.	Tudor England was a farming society.

		(present day, Celtic, Tudor)	Tudors ate a lot of fresh food.	<p>Water was collected from village pumps, wells or streams. Tudor families were larger than today. Life was very different for rich and poor Tudors. Ate lots of meat and seasonal fruit and vegetables.</p> <p>Celts were a warrior based society and were often at war with different tribes. They relied on farming for all their food. Farmed crops in summer; focused on animals in autumn; cut wood for fires in winter. Ate what they could grow or hunt.</p> <p>How Tudor and Celtic life is different to present day life.</p>

Being homeless means not having a permanent, safe place to live.
