What is the weather and climate like in India?	Some parts of the world are hot and some are cold depending on where they are. What and where the equator is. Africa is hot. South Pole is cold. India's bordering countries and surrounding seas.	Weather is what it's like outside each day. Climate is weather patterns over time. India's seasons: Winter, Pre-monsoon (Summer), Monsoon, Post-monsoon (Autumn). UK's seasons: Spring, Summer, Autumn, Winter. India has different climates due to its size. UK has one climate. It rains more and is hotter in India than the UK.
3		What is it like in India? (physical features)	Physical features are natural features on the Earth's surface. Types of physical features. Physical features of the 4 countries of the UK.	Physical features of India: it is a peninsula, Thar Desert, Himalayas mountain range, River Ganges, Deccan Plateau, eastern and Western Ghats.

4	What is it like in India? (human features)	Human features are made or built by humans. Types of human features. Human features of the 4 countries of the UK.	India: Population: over 1 billion. Capital city: New Delhi (11 million people). Other major cities: Mumbai, Bangalore, Kolkata, Chennai. Landmarks: Taj Mahal, Lotus Temple, Main religion: Hindu. UK: Population: 67 million. Capital city: London (8.9 million). Other major cities: Manchester, Birmingham, Glasgow, Liverpool. Landmarks: Buckingham Palace, Big Ben, St Paul's Cathedral. Main religion: Christianity.
